Curriculum at a glance...what have we been doing and what is coming up?

Language Arts...

- -Record independent work and set future goals for Daily Five
- -Reading Book Clubs
- -Adjectives/shades of meaning
- -Know and understand nonfiction text features
- -Ask and answer questions to build comprehension
- -Understand story structure and recount/retell the story
- -Identify the main idea in multiparagraph texts

Please let me know and I will help your child find "good fit" books to take from school to read at home. Helping your child establish good homework habits is essential to school success this year and in the years to come. Please let me know if you have any questions or concerns regarding our second grade homework plan. Thank you for your support!

- Please initial the Weekly Homework Checklist each day and help your child record what they
 read every day.
- Please make sure your child is using a pencil to do their homework, unless crayon/color is on the directions.
- Please remind your child to write their name on ALL of their papers.



What's new in school? Here are some questions you can ask your child!

- What science exploration did you do to find out how a canyon is formed?
 How did your land change when water dripped down on it (when it rained)?
- What is a law? Why are laws important? What are some laws we have in our community?
- What have you been learning about in music, P.E., and art class?
- In the beginning of the story *Stellaluna*, what happens to this little bat when an owl comes along? How does *Stellaluna* survive?
- The Paw Print Café will be open next week. Will you be using your paw prints to "purchase" anything?
- Is your desk neatly organized? How often do you need to reorganize it?
- Are you keeping your supplies organized in your desk and in your cubby basket?
