What's Happening in our classroom?



Here is a brief recap of our activities....

- We enjoyed a story about a kindly older man and his cat called *Mr. Putter and Tabby Pour the Tea.* There is a series of books with these characters and their neighbors. Their adventures are so simple, yet very popular with second graders.
- We read nonfiction articles about firefighters. This went along nicely with our discussions before our practice fire drills.
- In math we began to work on the first topic in our Envision math book: Fluently Add and Subtract Within 20. There will be information coming your way about online resources and games for your child. There is a homework component that will be coming home with your child this week. You can continue to play the math games in the Take Home Binder as well! And don't forget about Xtra Math as another option for getting math facts memorized.
- We began a review of manuscript letters during our handwriting time.
- During writing time, we continue to work on the steps in writing a
 narrative paragraph. We are working to find topics and learn how to
 focus on one event connected to that topic.

This week...

- "Good Fit Books" will be our big topic during our whole group reading time.
- We will read a story about understanding differences in communication, culture, and families. The story is about a deaf girl named Rosina. This story often leads to discussions and interest in learning more about sign language.
- In math we will continue to work on skills and strategies to use with addition and subtraction. Smaller groups of 2nd graders will meet in the morning to "target" individual instruction. We will also begin "timed tests" to help us gain fact power!
- We will work on our *Me on the Map* books during social studies/writing time.
- We will discuss and set goals for 2nd grade. Everyone will try to set at least one goal they would like to work to achieve this year. I always include my goal(s) as well.





HOMEWORK NOTES:

- -Please remind your child to write their name on all homework papers and to use pencil only, unless they want to highlight text to find answers on reading papers. (I will discuss this at conferences.)
- -Please initial and return the completed Weekly Homework Checklist along with other papers.
- -Continue to encourage your child to read daily and put forth their best effort in spelling, learning math facts, and having a positive attitude about homework!



Here are a few questions to get the conversation going about school...

Just ask your child....

- ~ Did you like Mr. Putter and Tabby? What were some of their adventures you read about? Would you like to read more of those books?
- ~What did you learn about fighting forest fires last week?
- ~What is the book Me on the Map about? How will your book be the same as this book?
- ~Do you think there is a book in your book box you could talk about with your class?
- ~Have you been returning your library books on Thursdays?
- ~Are you making good choices during Daily Five?
- ~Are you being the best listener you can be every day? Can you do better?
- ~Do you need some help in practicing your addition and subtraction facts?
